**Subject: Implementation of revised curricula of 63 trades under Craftsmen Training Scheme w.e.f. August,2014.**

**Sir/Madam**

This is to inform that core groups were formed by M/o L&E to review and revise the curriculum of various schemes of DGE&T. Mentor Councils with participation from academia, industry and Champion ITIs were formed for guidance and support to these core groups. These core groups have so far, revised curricula of 63 trades covering 11 sectors . These curricula were further put up on DGE&T website for wider consultation and comments and number of comments and suggestions were received from various stake holders and a large number of the suggestion for incorporation in respective syllabi.

The Sub-committee of NCVT on Norms and Courses, during its meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2014, approved revised curricula of all 63 trades covering 11 Sectors. The list of 63 revised trades is annexed. The revised curricula of all the 63 trades are available at DGE&T website dget.nic.in. While revising these curricula, due care has been taken that no change in machinery are proposed in 1<sup>st</sup> semester of the course, to allow immediate implementation of revised curricula and provide adequate time for procurement of new equipment included in curricula of II,III and IV semesters of respective trades.

These curricula shall be implemented from session starting from August, 2014 in all ITIs affiliated to NCVT. Accordingly, all the State Directors, dealing with Craftsmen Training are requested to issue necessary instruction to all ITIs under their control , to follow the revised curricula of NCVT affiliated trades, for imparting training under CTS.
